OLD BUSINESS

A. Presentation of 2014 Turkey Trot Report

SUBJECT: Approval of a Recommendation by the Parks and Recreation Board to Adopt an Ordinance, Waiving Section 6-3-2(B) Governing Park Hours, Section 9-1-3 Requiring the Issuance of Business Licenses and 6-3-9(I) Prohibiting Gambling, allowing the Friends of the Community Center to Hold Lincolnwood Fest 2015 on July 23-26.

SUMMARY AND BACKGROUND OF SUBJECT MATTER:

The Friends of the Community Center Committee will once again plan and implement Lincolnwood Fest, a four day festival in Proesel Park. The event will be held July 23-26, 2015. Music, food, a beer/wine tent, a car show, business exposition and a carnival will be featured as part of the weekend's activities. There will not be a pancake breakfast this year.

Hours for the event are as follows:

Thursday - 5:00-10:00 pm
Friday - 5:00-11:00 pm
Saturday - Noon-11:00 pm
Sunday - 10:00 am - 9:00 pm

Per Section 6-3-2(B) of the Village Code: No person shall be in or remain in Henry A. Proesel Park between the hours of 11:00 pm and 6:00 am on the following day, each and every day of the year. Fest activities will cease at regular closing time. The extension of park hours on Friday and Saturday, until 11:30 pm, will keep the park illuminated allowing for safe passage out of the park for visitors at the end of the night.

Per Section 9-1-3 of the Village Code: It is unlawful for any individual, firm or corporation to operate or conduct a business based within the Village without first having obtained a business license. Approval of this Ordinance will waive the business license fees for food and product vendors for the four-day festival.

Per Section 6-3-9(I) of the Village Code: Gambling is prohibited in the Park. Approval of this Ordinance will waive the enforcement of this section of the Code and will allow Bingo to be held during the festival.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The revenue produced by the sale of business licenses for Lincolnwood Fest is approximately \$250.

AN ORDINANCE WAIVING BUSINESS LICENSE FEE REQUIREMENTS
AND THE ENFORCEMENT OF SECTIONS 6-3-2(B) AND 6-3-9(I)
OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF LINCOLNWOOD
FOR LINCOLNWOOD FEST 2015

WHEREAS, the Village of Lincolnwood is a home rule municipality in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, the Friends of the Lincolnwood Community Center ("**FLCC**") is a not-for-profit organization organized to raise funds for the Lincolnwood Community Center; and

WHEREAS, the FLCC desires to host a carnival, festival and fair in Proesel Park ("**Park**") in the Village from July 23 through July 26, 2015, to be known as "**Lincolnwood Fest 2015**"; and

WHEREAS, Lincolnwood Fest 2015 will include, without limitation, the sale of food, wares, and merchandise by various merchants; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 1 of Chapter 9 of the Village Code, any entity that conducts a business, occupation, activity or establishment within the Village must obtain a business license from the Village and pay the required fee therefor; and

WHEREAS, Lincolnwood Fest 2015 is scheduled to end on Friday, July 24, and Saturday, July 25, 2015 at 11:00 p.m.; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 6-3-2(B) of the Municipal Code of Lincolnwood, as amended ("**Village Code**"), no person may be or remain in the Park between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. on the following day, each and every day of the year; and

WHEREAS, the Lincolnwood American Legion Post #1226 desires to conduct bingo games in the Park from 5:00 p.m. until 10:00 p.m. on July 24, 25, and 26, 2015 as part of Lincolnwood Fest 2015 ("**Proposed Bingo Games**"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 6-3-9(I) of the Village Code, gambling is prohibited in the Park; and

WHEREAS, the Village desires to: (i) extend the closing of the Park until 11:30 p.m. on July 24 and July 25, 2015, to afford visitors to Lincolnwood Fest 2015 an additional half-hour to exit the Park; and (ii) permit the operation of the Proposed Bingo Games during Lincolnwood Fest 2015; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees have determined that it will serve and be in the best interests of the Village to waive the enforcement of: (i) the business license fee requirements set forth in Article 1 of Chapter 9 of the Village Code with respect to the merchants that will sell food, wares, or merchandise at Lincolnwood Fest 2015; (ii) Section 6-3-2(B) of the Village Code to allow visitors to Lincolnwood Fest 2015 to remain in the Park until 11:30 p.m.

on July 24 and July 25, 2015; and (iii) Section 6-3-9(I) of the Village Code for the Proposed Bingo Games;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LINCOLNWOOD, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

SECTION 1. RECITALS. The facts and statements contained in the preamble to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Ordinance.

SECTION 2. WAIVER. The President and Board of Trustees hereby waive the enforcement of: (A) the business license fee requirements set forth in Article 1 of Chapter 9 of the Village Code with respect to the merchants that will sell food, wares, or merchandise at Lincolnwood Fest 2015; (B) Section 6-3-2(B) of the Village Code to allow visitors to the Fest to remain in the Park until 11:30 p.m. on July 24 and July 25, 2015; and (C) Section 6-3-9(I) of the Village Code to allow the Proposed Bingo Games during Lincolnwood Fest 2015.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Ordinance or part thereof is held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of this Ordinance will remain in full force and effect, and are to be interpreted, applied, and enforced so as to achieve, as near as may be, the purpose and intent of this Ordinance to the greatest extent permitted by applicable law.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance will be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication in the manner provided by law.

SUMMARY AND BACKGROUND OF SUBJECT MATTER:

The Special Education (SEED) Foundation for Niles Township District is a not-for-profit foundation created in 2013, which partners with Niles Township District for Special Education (NTDSE), parents and the community to provide resources to support and promote educational services and program for students at the Julia Molloy Education Center and other satellite sites. The SEED Foundation aims to facilitate partnerships within the community to promote awareness and understanding of people with disabilities while fostering inclusive opportunities for our students with disabilities.

The SEED Foundation has rented the Community Center on Saturday, April 18, 2015 for their fundraiser, an adults-only Trivia Night. The event will take place from 6:00-10:00 pm. Tickets will be sold for \$25 per person. They plan to have drawings for donated prizes and a trivia contest. They would also like to sell beer and wine, which is prohibited by the Village Code in section 10-2-36 (A). If the Board approves this Ordinance they will raise money through the sale of beer and wine for fundraising, in addition to the other activities at the event. If the Board does not approve this Ordinance, they will still hold the event but will charge more per person for the other activities offered as part of the event.

**AN ORDINANCE WAIVING ENFORCEMENT OF SECTION 10-2-36(A)
OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF LINCOLNWOOD
FOR THE SALE OF BEER AND WINE
AT THE LINCOLNWOOD COMMUNITY CENTER
BY THE NTDSE-ED FOUNDATION**

WHEREAS, the Village of Lincolnwood is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, the NTDSE-ED Foundation ("**Foundation**") is a not-for-profit organization organized under the laws of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the Foundation desires to host a Trivia Night fundraiser on April 18, 2015 ("**Event**"), in the Lincolnwood Community Center located at 6900 North Lincoln Avenue in the Village ("**Community Center**"); and

WHEREAS, the Foundation desires to sell beer and wine at the Event; and

WHEREAS, Section 10-2-36(A) of the Municipal Code of Lincolnwood ("**Village Code**") prohibits the sale or distribution of alcoholic beverages for tangible consideration at the Community Center; and

WHEREAS, the Foundation has filed a request with the Village Board, seeking a waiver of enforcement of Section 10-2-36(A) of the Village Code to permit the sale of beer and wine at the Event ("**Requested Waiver**"); and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees have considered the request of the Foundation and have determined that it will grant the Requested Waiver, but only in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance, and specifically subject to the conditions set forth in this Ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF LINCOLNWOOD, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

SECTION 1. RECITALS. The facts and statements contained in the preamble to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Ordinance.

SECTION 2. WAIVER. In accordance with the home rule powers of the Village, and subject to, and contingent upon, the conditions, restrictions, and provisions set forth in Section 3 of this Ordinance, the Village President and Board of Trustees hereby waive the enforcement of Section 10-2-36(A) of the Village Code to the extent necessary to permit the sale of beer and wine at the Event.

SECTION 3. CONDITIONS. Notwithstanding any right that may be applicable or available pursuant to the provisions of the Village Code or any other rights the Foundation may have, the waiver granted in Section Two of this Ordinance is hereby expressly subject to and contingent upon the operation of the Event in compliance with each and all of the following conditions:

- A. Compliance with Regulations. Except to the extent specifically provided otherwise in this Ordinance, the operation of the Event must comply at all times with all applicable Village codes and ordinances, as the same have been or may be amended from time to time.

- B. Dispensation, Sale, and Consumption of Alcoholic Beverages.
 - 1. Compliance with Liquor Ordinance. No alcoholic beverage may be dispensed, served or consumed at the Event except in strict compliance with Article 2 of Chapter 11 of the Village Code. Specifically, and without limitation of the foregoing:
 - a. Liquor Licenses. No alcoholic beverage may be dispensed, served or consumed at the Event prior to the issuance to the Foundation of all state and Village liquor licenses necessary therefor.
 - b. Community Center Permit. No alcoholic beverage may be dispensed, served or consumed at the Event prior to the issuance to the Foundation of a permit therefor, in accordance with Sections 10-2-36(B) and 10-2-36(C) of the Village Code.
 - c. Insurance. The Foundation must procure all insurance policies required pursuant to Sections 10-2-9 and 10-2-36(B)(3) of the Village Code.
 - d. Product Sampling. No beer or wine may be dispensed at the Event in violation of the product sampling regulations set forth in Section 10-2-35 of the Village Code.
 - 2. Sales of Beer and Wine Only. Other than beer and wine, no spirits or other alcoholic beverage may be dispensed, sold, or consumed at the Event.
 - 3. Responsible Alcohol Service Training. Prior to the commencement of the Event, the manager of the Event, and all persons who will sell, mix, prepare, serve, or deliver alcoholic beverages at the Event, must complete the Beverage Alcohol Sellers and Servers Education and Training (BASSET) program, or a similar responsible alcohol service training program.

4. Off-Premises Consumption Prohibited. No alcoholic beverage dispensed or served at the Event may be consumed off of the Community Center premises.
- C. Sale of Food and Beverages. No food or nonalcoholic beverages may be sold at the Event, except upon: (1) proper inspection by the Cook County Department of Health; and (2) the issuance of all Village permits required therefor.
- D. Raffles. No raffle may be conducted at the Event except: (1) in accordance with the Illinois Raffles Act, 230 ILCS 15/1 *et seq.* and Article 14 of Chapter 9 of the Village Code; and (2) upon issuance of a license therefor pursuant to Article 14 of Chapter 9 of the Village Code.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Ordinance or part thereof is held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of this Ordinance will remain in full force and effect, and are to be interpreted, applied, and enforced so as to achieve, as near as may be, the purpose and intent of this Ordinance to the greatest extent permitted by applicable law.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.

- A. This Ordinance will be effective only upon the occurrence of all of the following events:
 1. Passage by the Village President and Board of Trustees in the manner required by law;
 2. Publication in pamphlet form in the manner required by law; and
 3. The filing by the Foundation with the Village Clerk of an Unconditional Agreement and Consent, in the form of **Exhibit A** attached to and, by this reference, made a part of this Ordinance, to accept and abide by each and all of the terms, conditions, and limitations set forth in this Ordinance and to indemnify the Village for any claims that may arise in connection with the approval of this Ordinance.
- B. In the event the Foundation does not file fully executed copies of the Unconditional Agreement and Consent, as required by Section 5.A.3 of this Ordinance, within 30 days after the date of final passage of this Ordinance, the Village President and Board of Trustees will have the right, in its sole discretion, to declare this Ordinance null and void and of no force or effect.

EXHIBIT A

UNCONDITIONAL AGREEMENT AND CONSENT

TO: The Village of Lincolnwood, Illinois ("**Village**"):

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 2014-_____, adopted by the Village President and Board of Trustees on _____, 2014 ("**Ordinance**"), grants a waiver of enforcement from Section 10-2-36(A) of "The Municipal Code of Lincolnwood," as amended, to permit the sale of beer by The Beverage Retailers Foundation of Illinois ("**Foundation**") at the Event on July 13 and 14, 2014, at the Lincolnwood Community Center; and

WHEREAS, Section 5 of the Ordinance provides, among other things, that the Ordinance will be of no force or effect unless and until the Foundation has filed, within 30 days following the passage of the Ordinance, its unconditional agreement and consent to accept and abide by each and all of the terms, conditions, and limitations set forth in the Ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Foundation does hereby agree and covenant as follows:

1. The Foundation hereby unconditionally agrees to accept, consent to, and abide by each and all of the terms, conditions, limitations, restrictions, and provisions of the Ordinance.

2. The Foundation acknowledges and agrees that the Village is not and will not be, in any way, liable for any damages or injuries that may be sustained as a result of the Village's authorization of the operation of the Event or its adoption of the Ordinance, and that the Village's approvals do not, and will not, in any way, be deemed to insure the Foundation against damage or injury of any kind and at any time.

3. The Foundation hereby agrees to hold harmless and indemnify the Village, the Village's corporate authorities, and all Village elected and appointed officials, officers, employees, agents, representatives, and attorneys, from any and all claims that may, at any time, be asserted against any of such parties in connection with the Village's adoption of the Ordinance authorizing the operation of the Event.

RE: Slammers Field Reservations

As you may recall, the Slammers Softball Association has requested the permission to hold a fundraising tournament in Proesel Park during the summer months for the past few years. Due to their affiliation with School District #219 the fees have been waived. Last year there was question as to whether this type of fundraising event should fall under the intergovernmental agreement established between Morton Grove and Skokie Park Districts, Village of Lincolnwood and School District #219.

Morton Grove Park District actually charged Slammers for field space last year, but it was at a reduced rate. Skokie continues to provide all field space at no charge.

Staff recommend approving the tournament, but establishing a fee to the Slammers for their use of the Proesel Park fields for their fundraising tournament in 2015.

Price per field per hour:	\$75.00	\$40.00	\$20.00

The per hour cost recommended for the Slammers is considerably less than the non-resident rate, but allows for the Village to capture funds to cover overhead and material costs. Currently, only five of the 37 players on the Slammers are Lincolnwood residents.

Staff recommends charging the Slammers \$1,360 for their rental of the fields, based on 68 hours of field rental, utilizing the rate of \$20 per hour. The Slammers will also be charged the direct cost of field materials such as Diamond Dry and turf conditioner. Of course, the invoiced amount for field usage will be adjusted, based on the actual number of fields and hours used during the tournament.

Dear Chris,

This letter and support documents are in response to our conversation about Slammers Softball's request for use of diamonds at Proesel Park on the weekend of July 10-12, 2015. We respectfully request the use of the facility to host a portion of the Slammers Splash Tournament. Other locations are in Skokie and possibly Morton Grove.

I'll try to respond to your questions briefly but informatively.

Tournament Description:

Aside from fees paid by each family, the Splash Tournament is the primary means of income for the program. Revenue from player's fees fall far short of the expenses of the program, most notably: insurance, coach stipends, tournaments, umpires and uniform. Our ability to conduct this fundraising event is significant to the families who choose to play in our program. We are able to provide them with a relatively affordable, competitive fast-pitch experience. Without the Splash, we would have to raise player's fees almost 2-fold in order to meet expenses. This would realistically be too much expense for our families to bear, and result in program failure. So we really count on the parks departments to supply fields where we can play the tournament.

Community:

Our affiliation with High School District 219 and inclusion within the Intergovernmental Agreement between the school district and Niles Township communities has been advantageous to both the community park districts and us. We are loyal to district residents, conduct free clinics for players and coaches and support house recreational leagues.

Slammers History:

D219 Slammers Softball, Inc. is a 501(c)(3) not for profit organization dedicated to the development of softball training for youth girls in Niles township. Our status as the feeder softball program for District 219 together with our district residency goals demonstrates our dedication to the community. Many other "travel" programs do not have residency requirements or an

attachment to a community. The three year average for Niles Township residency for Slammers is 92%.

Games / times:

I've attached a copy of last year's schedule for the 12U division, the only games we scheduled for Proesel Park. Although many of the games were canceled due to rain, I anticipate a similar schedule for 2015. We would expect 32 games scheduled around adult softball on Friday night and Sunday morning.

2015 Splash:

We expect a smaller tournament next year since we may not have a 16U division. We seek Proesel Park because of the terrific environment and hospitality of the park employees. Everyone we have dealt with has been accommodating. Having 4 diamonds at a central location makes running the tournament more feasible than otherwise and the scheduling of our on-site volunteers, efficient.

Finally, I'm attaching a copy of the tournament advertisement we will post on popular internet sites for youth softball tournaments by January so that we may begin registering teams.

Please let me know if I can provide any more details on the above areas of concern. We appreciate your consideration of our request.

RE: O'Brien Park Renovation

During the 2005-2006 fiscal year, a Playground Replacement Program was established as part of the Village capital plan. The goal of the program is to gradually replace the aging, outdated playgrounds in the Village parks. So far, Columbia, Kildare, Rossi, Goebelt, Kenneth, Springfield, and Drake playgrounds have been replaced. After O'Brien Park is completed, the priority for replacement is Proesel, GG Rowell, Flowers and Central.

In the 2014-2015 budget, \$100,000 was allocated for playground replacement. O'Brien Park, located at 7260 East Prairie Road, was chosen as the next park in need of replacement. The equipment at O'Brien Park is rusted, outdated and no longer meets the safety standards adopted by the ASTM (American Standard for Testing Materials).

Staff initiated the Request for Proposal (RFP) process for renovation of O'Brien Park in January. On January 19 staff released the RFP for the playground design. Contacts were made with many playground manufacturers and architectural firms at the Illinois Park and Recreation conference at the end of January. On January 22 a legal notice was put in the Pioneer Press. The deadline for submitting designs was noon on Thursday, February 5. After receiving all design submissions, the Village staff voted on their favorite design. Staff also took the designs to Club Kid, the Village afterschool program held at the schools, on February 9 for the participants to vote for their favorite design. Residents within a ¼ mile of the park were invited to attend Tuesday's meeting to view the designs and provide input. Approximately 750 letters were mailed.

A copy of the Request for Proposal document follows this memorandum, as well as the electronic submittals from each of the ten companies that provided designs. There will be a brief presentation at Tuesday's meeting and then a short break will be taken to allow residents and board members to view all the park options and place their votes for their favorite design. There will ten design boards showing these options set up in the Council Chambers. After the Park

Board and the residents have weighed in, staff will present the results of the Village employee and Club Kid voting. The Park Board will then take into consideration all of the input and put forth a recommendation in the form of a motion to proceed with the development of bid documents.

The project schedule is as follows:

- February 10 Park Board recommendation
- February 11 Contact chosen vendor
- February 18 Release bid packet
- March 6 Sealed bids due
- March 17 Present recommendation to Village Board
- Week of March 31 Disassemble playground (Kids Around the World)
- Week of April 7 Install new playground

The current play structures will be donated to Kids around the World, which is an organization out of Rockford, Illinois that removes and refurbishes playground equipment and reinstalls in underprivileged areas within the United States and other countries. The Village worked with Kids around the World in 2013 when Drake Park was renovated. The play structures went to communities in Lebanon and Israel.



This Request for Proposals (RFP) has been prepared by the Village of Lincolnwood in order to retain the services of a qualified firm to provide Equipment and Materials for the renovation of Charles L. O'Brien Park in Lincolnwood, Illinois.

For the purpose of this RFP and the anticipated Agreement, "Village" means the Village of Lincolnwood, and "Services" means the provision of Equipment and Materials for the renovation of Charles L. O'Brien Park ("Park").

The selected contractor will be invited to enter into an agreement with the Village, in a form to be provided by the Village ("Agreement"), to provide the equipment in accordance with the Project Scope section of this RFP. The Village Board has the ultimate authority to approve any proposal and to authorize execution of the negotiated Agreement.

Section I: Project Background

The Village of Lincolnwood is a thriving community of approximately 12,590 people. The Village lies approximately 10 miles northwest of downtown Chicago. The Village is a full-service community that provides police, fire, emergency medical, public works, and parks and recreation services for the safety and enjoyment of residents and visitors.

The Village's Parks and Recreation Department offers and operates a full range of sports and recreation programs. It manages 13 parks, an outdoor pool complex, nine tennis courts, 11 baseball diamonds, and a community center.

The Park is located at 7260 East Prairie Road in Lincolnwood. The Park's current amenities include playground equipment in three play areas, which includes a bay of swings and a sand play area with diggers, picnic areas, green space, and a half-court basketball court ("Amenities"). The Park also has a barrier between the playground and the sidewalk surrounding the Park and a sculpture.

Section II: Project Scope

The Village is seeking a firm to provide all of the requisite Equipment and Materials to renovate the Park, which renovation will include replacing all of the Amenities and renovating the basketball court (which includes resurfacing the court and screening the court from the rest of the Park and the streets) (all equipment and materials needed to replace the Amenities and to renovate the basketball court are, collectively, the "Equipment and Materials"). The Village does not desire to replace the existing sculpture in the Park; proposers must work the existing sculpture into their designs.

The renovated Park must serve all ages and should comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act and Illinois Disability Guidelines. The Park must have appropriate signage, walkways, ramps, and access points to enable efficient movement and use of the Park. All playgrounds and the Equipment and Materials therein must comply with the National Recreation and Parks Playground Safety Inspection guidelines. The Village's total budget for the Park renovation,

including all Equipment, Materials, construction, and installation is \$100,000, and the Village's expectation is that all of the renovation work will be complete by April 30, 2015

The Village is issuing this RFP for proposers to submit proposals, which must include, without limitation, proposed designs and specifications ("Design Proposal") for the proposed Park renovation. The Design Proposal must include: See attachment A

The selected proposer's Design Proposal will then be used to solicit bids for a firm ("Construction Firm") to renovate the Park based on the selected proposer's Design Proposal. Proposers responding to this RFP may, but are not required to, submit bids in response to the request for bids for construction.

The firm that is selected pursuant to this RFP will be invited to enter into the Agreement with the Village, which Agreement will be provided by the Village. The Agreement will require that the selected proposer provide all of the Equipment and Materials set forth in the Design Proposal so that the Construction Firm can renovate the park and install the Equipment and Materials in accordance with the selected proposer's Design Proposal.

All Equipment and Materials provided by the proposer must be new and first quality as to construction, workmanship and appearance.

The Services provided by the selected proposer will also include, at no extra cost:

1. Assisting the Village in supervising the Construction Firm to ensure that the Construction Firm properly implements the Design Proposal and installs the Equipment and Materials provided by the proposer.
2. Answering all questions asked by the Village and the Construction Firm so that the Design Proposal may be properly implemented and all Equipment and Materials properly installed.

Section III: Submittal Requirements

All proposals must be signed by an authorized official of the proposer. Proposals that contain omissions, erasures, alterations, conditional quotes, or that contain irregularities of any kind may be rejected.

The proposal should contain, without limitation, the following information at a minimum:

A. Contact Information

- Name of proposer; and
- Office address, main telephone and fax numbers, e-mail address, and website address.

B. List of Qualifications and Certifications, and Required Licensing. The proposer shall provide the following:

- General information about the proposer, its history and services;
- The resume of the owner/supervisor of the proposer and the person responsible for overseeing and completing the Design Proposal, including these individuals' certifications, degrees and experience.

C. References. The proposer shall provide a list of at least three agencies for which the proposer designed playground and park equipment and materials. The proposal must include the contact information for these references.

D. Design Proposals. The proposer shall submit the Design Proposals in an electronic format. A copy of all design drawings that are part of the Design Proposal must also be provided in a large board format, 48"x36" is preferred.

D. Proposal and Fee Structure.

- The proposer shall describe all the costs and fees associated with the provision of the Services, including an itemized list of the cost for each piece of Equipment and all Materials. The fee summary should clearly identify the proposed not-to-exceed fee, inclusive of all goods and services, for the provision of the Services in accordance with the Project Scope provided in Section II of this RFP.
- The not-to-exceed costs specified by the proposer are to include all direct and indirect costs of implementing the Services, and the Village shall not be bound to pay any additional costs absent a written change order.

E. Letter.

A letter indicating that all information in the proposal is true and complete and signed by the authorized owner, partner, officer of the corporation, or manager of the limited liability company submitting the proposal, with said signature duly notarized by a notary public.

Section IV: Evaluation of Proposals

Professional Village Staff will evaluate all properly submitted proposals and present the properly submitted proposals to the Village's Parks and Recreation Advisory Board and residents in the Village for recommendations and feedback.

The Village staff will then grade and rank all properly submitted proposals with respect to the Project Scope set forth in this Request for Proposals, including the total cost of the Services, responsiveness of the proposal, and the recommendations and feedback from the Village's Parks and Recreation Advisory Board and the residents of the Village.

The Village will then select the top preferred proposer, with whom the Agreement, on a form to be provided by the Village, will be negotiated. The Village Board of Trustees has the ultimate authority to approve any proposal and to authorize execution of the negotiated Agreement.

The Village reserves the right to make clarifications, corrections, or changes in this Request for Proposals at any time prior to the deadline for the submission of proposals. All proposers or prospective proposers will be informed of said clarifications, corrections, or changes.

Section V: Submittal Procedures

I would like to thank you for the opportunity to present this proposal for the Charles L. O'Brien Park playground renovation. Our assumptions and understanding of the assignment are outlined below:

STATEMENT OF UNDERSTANDING:

- Provide the requisite Equipment and Materials to renovate playground and resurface the basketball court.
- Provide screening for the basketball court from other areas in the park and protection from the street.
- Meet requirements of ADA and guidelines from the National Recreation and Parks Playground Safety Inspection upon installation. Also follow guidelines from CPSC.
- Materials, labor, and equipment are intended to be completed within an overall budget of \$100,000.00. The Village desires to have the work completed by April 30, 2015.
- Prepare documents to solicit bids for the renovation of the park, based upon the design equipment selected from our submittal.
- Assist the Village to solicit bids from Construction Firms to renovate the park, based upon the design you and the public select. Assist with the Bidding process, including answering questions and issuing Addenda as needed to clarify the bidding process and intent of the design and construction.
- We understand we will work without a topographic base survey. While we don't recommend this approach, due to the size and relative simplicity of the project, we will proceed under this approach. If the Village would prefer to have us obtain a topographic survey, 3D Design can arrange for this to be done with a registered land surveyor as an Additional Service.
- We anticipate any information the Village has will be provided for creating a plan (Plat of Survey, other related documents, etc.).

SCOPE OF SERVICES

I. SITE INVESTIGATION, PRELIMINARY THROUGH FINAL DESIGN

- A. We will meet with you on site to review existing conditions, discuss the selected equipment design, discuss any revisions or changes to the equipment and/or play area and to photograph the area for our use during the project. Shelter
